New MiChart order pathways for the BioFire® Meningitis/Encephalitis PCR Panel (MEPAN)

Effective April 16, 2025

DETAILS:

The clinical microbiology team is proud to announce that the **BioFire® Meningitis/Encephalitis PCR Panel (MEPAN)** is now available for use at Michigan Medicine through a new reflex testing algorithm for cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) specimens. The MEPAN can also be ordered directly with appropriate infectious disease approval or when used as indicated by the febrile infant guidelines (https://michmed-clinical.policystat.com/policy/12261468/latest/).

- The BioFire ME Panel detects **14 common viral, bacterial, and fungal pathogens** that cause meningitis and encephalitis.
- It provides **rapid results** (within 1–2 hours of receipt) and will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- Standalone testing for Enterovirus has been discontinued by the manufacturer but is available as a routine part of this panel.

Reflex Criteria:

When "CSF Analysis with Reflex to MEPAN" is selected, MEPAN add-on testing will be automatically performed on CSF specimens that meet **any** of the following criteria:

- WBC > 5 cells/mm³
- Protein > 50 mg/dL
- Glucose < 40 mg/dL

Non-reflexed Order Options:

- Order MEPAN with Infectious Disease Approval
- Order MEPAN as recommended by febrile infant guidelines (0-60 days old)

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The FilmArray Meningitis/Encephalitis Panel (MEPAN) is a qualitative multiplexed nucleic acid amplification <i>in vitro</i> diagnostic test capable simultaneous detection and identification of multiple bacterial, viral, and yeast nucleic acids directly from cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) specime obtained via lumbar puncture from individuals with signs and/or symptoms of meningitis and/or encephalitis.
